On the second Sunday of the Lenten season, our gospel lesson will be Mark 8: 31-18 where, once again in Mark's version of events of Jesus' life, the disciples (especially Peter) are proving to be a group of bunglers who "just don't get it." In this passage, however, Jesus calls to all who would

hear him and challenges them to deny themselves, take up their cross, and follow him in a life of "doing justly, loving mercy, and walking humbly with our God." If, however, we are inclined to reject the path of discipleship because the price is too high or because Jesus asks too much of us. he warns that we will lose our very souls. If, on the other hand, we choose to follow him, we may very well face significant losses. That's the down side. But Jesus also promises that if we follow him we will actually have gained our very souls because the path of self-giving is the way to freedom, and true joy, and to all the life that God wants to give us each and every day.

The Melrose Annual General Meeting is February 25th directly following the service. Hard copies of the Annual Report will be available Sunday, February 18th at worship.

At the Melrose Annual Meeting on February 25th, the following motion will be presented for the consideration of the congregation:

Motion: that the congregation approve the withdrawal of up to \$27,000 from the capital of the Sustaining Fun to meet the needs of the 2018 operating budget.

◆ Proposed Committee Restructuring ◆

Official Board has reviewed our obligations with respect overseeing the considerable property to appropriately management functions of the church. Over time, we have evolved to have responsibility for substantial leasing and renting functions, which frankly were never anticipated within typical church governance structures, and which don't fit comfortably within a usual Property Committee framework. Successfully and leasing/rental managing our property issues is vital sustainability and a key responsibility of the Board. With the support of the Property Committee, the Official Board is recommending a change to our current committee structure. We are proposing that the Property Committee be replaced with a Resource Management subcommittee of the Official Board. This subcommittee would have responsibility for oversight of the broad property management functions and needs of the church, and would, through combining property, administrative, and financial expertise within its membership, help to ensure clear and timely decision-making and oversight of our property management functions. Additional information regarding this proposal is included in my submission within the Annual Report.

Procedurally, the congregation must approve changes to committee structures. This approval will be sought at our upcoming AGM. Please feel free to contact me (cheryl.rn@sympatico.ca) if you have any questions about this proposal.
