One of the themes of the Epiphany season is the "manifestation" of divinity in the person of Jesus (many of our Epiphany hymns feature this word). The first such recognition occurs at Jesus' birth, especially in the story of the magi's visit, but biblically speaking the second is his baptism by John in the river Jordan. Again in this narrative God is the initiator and we are the receivers of grace. Appropriately Jesus' baptism will be the centrepiece of worship this Sunday. In the Gospel of Mark's version of these events (Mark 1: 4-11) we learn that John the Baptist's baptismal practice had two components -- repentance and forgiveness. As John

explains it, baptism is not only with water, but with the Holy Spirit. These elements are still true of baptism today. The baptismal liturgy marks the beginning of a new life lived in God's grace and forgiveness. On this second Sunday of the Epiphany season we will also welcome through baptism of water and the Spirit a new member to the church family of Christ: Aubrey Denis Mae Shellard-Sweet.
